Beginning with their Annual General Meeting on Monday, November 6. the final steps of a reorganization plan, which will result in financial benefits to NWT Dene First Nations, was approved. The Annual General Meeting was followed with a welcoming reception and remarkable display of traditional visual and performing arts.

The theme of the conference was "Establishing Economic Cooperation." Representatives from major industry sectors and the NWT aboriginal business community attended and carried out dialogue on business opportunities and workforce development as key elements of establishing economic cooperation.

During the conference, Denendeh investments Inc. (DII) announce two new partnerships: with Tom Jackson of Homes Inc. to provide housing to NWT communities; and, with Gwich'in Development corporation which now involves the Mackenzie Aboriginal Coronation (MAC) consortium.

CKLB, owned by the Native Communications Society of the Western NWT, broadcasted highlights of the conference, including a presentation by Chief Clarence Louie, Osoyoos Indian Band. We recieved phone calls and email from people in the communities expressing their appreciation for the live broadcast and acknowledging they were touched by Chief Louie's talk. "This presentation and others will be posted on our website," said Darrell Beaulieu CEO, DII and DDC Group of Companies. "This is our 1st Annual NWT Aboriginal Business Conference. The high energy of the past four days has been terrific and we are looking forward to the 2007 conference."
